

PASTORAL MESSAGE
Fifth World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly

Dear Brothers and Sisters in Christ,

This year, we will celebrate the **World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly on Sunday, 27th July, 2025**. The late Pope Francis established the World Day of Grandparents and the Elderly in 2021 to be celebrated annually on the fourth Sunday of July, close to the feast of Sts. Joachim and Anne, the grandparents of Jesus. I greet you all with a heart full of affection, especially those who are in the golden years of life. The fourth Sunday of July is set aside not only to honour you, but to truly listen to your stories, to learn from your wisdom, and to thank you for the love and faith you continue to pass on.

The theme for this year's celebration, "*Blessed are those who have not lost hope*" (cf. Sir 14:2) invites us to reflect on the enduring strength of hope. Even amid life's trials; illness, loneliness, or the quiet pain of feeling forgotten, Grandparents and the Elderly are a living witness to the power of hope. Let us all walk together in hope. And may our communities be renewed by the grace that flows from generations united in love and faith.
